Dining Dollars

Dining Dollars may be used in the cafeteria and Founders' Café. **With Dining Dollars**, students...

- Save 11% off retail prices. In addition to a 6% savings on sales tax, a 5% discount is given at the register for each purchase.
- You do not need to carry cash or a separate credit card. The campus ID, the Shield, works like a debit card for Dining Dollars.

Dining Dollars are required for Dormitory residents (see next column for amounts). Required Dining Dollars purchased for the fall semester can be used through the

last day of the January Winter Term. Required Dining Dollars purchased for the spring semester can be used through the last day of the July Summer Term. A refund of required Dining Dollars is given only in the case of a mid-semester withdrawal according to SBTS policy.

Voluntary Dining Dollars (which are dining dollars students add to their account over and above the required amount) continue to roll over each term until graduation or withdrawal, at which time the student will be refunded any remaining balance in accordance with SBTS policy.

Boyce College Residents. The required Dining Dollar Plan for Boyce dormitory residents is **\$850** per fall and spring semester. All non-dormitory students can choose to take advantage of the savings by purchasing voluntary Dining Dollars.

Southern Seminary Residents. The required Dining Dollar Plan for SBTS dormitory residents is **\$400** per fall and spring semester. All non-dormitory students can choose to take advantage of the savings by purchasing voluntary Dining Dollars.

Financial Aid Information

How do I apply for an SBTS scholarship?

1. Complete the admissions process and be accepted into a degree program before the financial aid deadline. (Only full time, on-campus master's or undergraduate level students are eligible for financial aid.)
2. Once you are accepted, you will receive a personalized SBTS e-campus ID and password. At this time, you are eligible to apply for financial aid using the SBTS Online Financial Aid Application.
3. Complete all parts of the SBTS Online Financial Aid Application (<https://finaid.sbts.edu>), and submit

three thank you letters to the financial aid office by the financial aid deadline:

- Students entering Fall semester – July 15 of each year (prior to entering)
- Students entering Spring semester – Dec. 1 of each year (prior to entering)
- Continuing students - April 16 for Fall Semester, December 1 for Spring Semester

What types of scholarships are awarded?

Scholarships are awarded annually to qualifying students. Students may apply for one of the following scholarships:

- **Mission Tuition Discount** – This program provides 50% tuition assistance for master-level studies to fulltime missionaries of the IMB and NAMB of the Southern Baptist Convention, plus Journeymen, ISC, and US2 workers. - **MK Tuition Discount** – The program provides 100% tuition assistance for undergraduate and master-level studies to the dependent children of fulltime SBC missionaries of IMB or NAMB.
- **Rice-Judson Scholarship** – This scholarship is for entering first semester students only. The scholarship is awarded for the first two semesters of master's level studies in the amount of \$1250 per semester. Qualifications for this scholarship include a minimum GPA of 3.5 and significant ministry experience.
- **General Scholarship** – Students enrolled in a master's level or undergraduate degree program are eligible to apply for a general scholarship. Students must demonstrate financial need to qualify for this scholarship. Scholarship awards range from \$50 - \$900 per semester for master's level students and \$25 - \$250 per semester for undergraduate level students, and are based upon demonstrated financial need.
- **Spouse and Children's Discount Program** – Spouses or dependents of full-time students may be eligible for a 50% tuition discount. Qualifying students must apply midway through the semester by submitting the spouse/dependent form to the Office of Accounting. For more information, please contact Accounting Services, 502-897-4128.
- Ph.D., D.Miss., D.M.A., and Th.M. Students should contact the Office of Doctoral Studies for information on the Resident Doctoral Studies Grant. Other doctoral programs are not eligible for a SBTS scholarship or grant.

What other types of aid may I receive from outside sources?

Southern Seminary does not participate in any federal or state student aid programs involving loans or grants. Generally, students are eligible to receive aid from any source that does not require the school to participate in the federal loan or grant program (Title IV program). 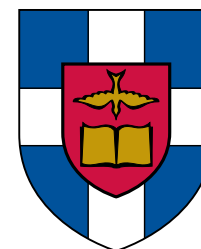
