Primary responsibilities

I am the lead planter/pastor of Crossing Church and my primary responsibilities include preaching, raising up new leaders, leading the church to be on mission, and coaching the church planters we are sending out from our congregation.

Ministry Description

Our vision is to establish a vibrant, missional, congregation in Louisville's East End that will reach our area and beyond. Our mission statement is, "Journeying together to become like Christ and invite others into God's family." We are pursuing evangelism and discipleship within the context of healthy biblical community. It is our desire to see individuals and communities transformed by the Gospel. In the current phase of our strategy, we are both missional and attractional. We equip and encourage our people to reach their spheres of influence with the Gospel as well as reach out to the community at large through strategically designed "Bridge Events."

How did your church planting training at Southern help you in preparation for your work on the field?

My training provided a sound theological foundation and exposed me to a variety of different church planting methods. I also formed a number of relationships that will benefit me for years to come.

What are the greatest blessings received since you have been involved in church planting?

The greatest blessings are at least three in number. First, it has been a blessing to see peoples' eternities and daily lives transformed by the Gospel. We have been fortunate to see a number of people come to faith and many others grow in the faith. Second, we have been able to send out two church planting teams and we are just over one year old. Third, it has been a blessing to see our children LOVE to go to church.

What advice would you give to those who are wondering if God is calling them to be involved in church planting?

Trust God to do great things and be patient with the process. Church planting is one of the most difficult things you will ever do in your entire life. It is truly a God-sized task. Listen for God's voice through prayer, His Word, and the counsel of those who have gone before. Only those who feel specifically called to plant and have seen that calling confirmed by other believers should undertake church planting. Pray like you've never prayed before. Keep others praying for you. Realize that the Great Commission is more than just evangelism, but disciple-making. Don't give up. Most church plants do not become mega-churches. If you are called to church planting, stay the course. I think many guys quit too soon when they don't see what they thought they were going to see.

Regarding church planting, what counsel would you give to those who are called to serve in established churches?

God puts His people in strategic places that are different. Not everyone is called and equipped to plant churches. First, be catalytic in encouraging your congregation to become more missional at every level, especially in personal evangelism and giving to missions. Encourage your congregation to think more strategically about putting an "outward face" on what they are already doing. Remind them that North America is one of the largest mission fields in the world. Second, adopt a church planter(s) for prayer (and potentially financial support). Get pictures of the planters. Get emails. Inform your people about what they can do to help. Third, speak well of church planting every chance you get. Many people in established churches do not have church planting on their radars. Talk with your congregation about reaching the people other churches are not reaching. Inform the congregation that it takes different kinds of churches to reach different kinds of people.

Did you know this about NAMB?

- Mission Statement: “To proclaim the gospel of Jesus Christ, start New Testament congregations, minister to persons in the name of Christ, and assist churches in the United States, Canada and U.S. territories in effectively performing these functions.”
- In 2006: Southern Baptists established 1,725 new congregations, 61% of which were non-Anglo congregations.
- In 2006: An estimated estimated 194,872 Southern Baptists participated in short-term projects through NAMB.
