28500 Intro to Christian Philosophy **3 hours**

30000 Christian Preaching **3 hours**

A basic course in principles of preaching as they relate to exegesis of the Hebrew and Greek texts, context, content, application, structure, style, and delivery of sermons. 30020 Preaching Practicum **3 hours**

Sermons by students who are preparing for a preaching ministry will be analyzed and evaluated by the instructor using live and video techniques with attention given to biblical content, organization, application, style, and delivery.
