40150 Personal Spiritual Disciplines **2 hours**

An integrative approach to Christian spirituality emphasizing biblical, classical, and contemporary materials. This course will assist the student in personal discipleship through spiritual disciplines such as prayer, Scripture memory, Bible study, fasting, journaling, and personal evangelism. 25100 Church History I **3 hours**

40080 Ministry of Leadership **3 hours**

A study of the nature of Christian leadership in the context of the local church ministry. The church as an organism and an organization is examined. The nature and purpose of the church is analyzed. Essential

27060 Systematic Theology I **3 hours**
