- Courses coded in **blue** are required for all M.Div. programs.
- Courses coded in **green** are required for at least one M.Div. program and can generally be counted as electives in other programs (12 hours).
- An average of nine hours per semester on site = 7 semesters (3.5 years, depending on remedial work) to complete the rotation. This will be equivalent to up to 64 hours credit on site, including 2 hours for Applied Ministry at some point (note that 40010 Personal Spiritual Disciplines is a prerequisite to Applied Ministry and will be offered in J-terms as well as in Burlington). Elementary Greek (0 hours), Elementary Hebrew (0 hours) will be taken online. These 7 semesters will put the student within 24 hours of graduation. The current on-campus requirement of at least 18 hours can be satisfied with J-term courses or with residency or a combination. Additionally, up to 30 hours may be earned online, but will not count toward the on-campus requirement or for hours earned at the Vermont site.
- Extension center students may satisfy any of these requirements with additional hours on campus or with supplementary courses online. Many of these same core courses are available online. J-term offerings will include some core courses as well as school-specific electives beyond the 58-hour M.Div. core.
