In its spring concert the orchestra paid tribute to Leroy Anderson, in this year of his 100th birthday. There is more to be said about Mr. Anderson, and more music to be played, including "Sleigh Ride," usually played closer to Christmas.

For the past three Pops concerts, mothers have assisted their talented daughters. This year a precocious 12-year-old violinist, Joy Kim, will be accompanied not by her mother, but by her pianist father, Ray Kim.

For cinema lovers there will be movie music: The Magnificent Seven and a medley of themes from James Bond, Agent 007.

In addition to orchestra music, there will be some outstanding feature performers this year, not the least of which are The Singing Men of St. Stephen Baptist Church here in Louisville, led by its distinguished conductor Kevin James. We don't know the titles yet, but whatever his men sing will bring great enjoyment to everybody in attendance.

Louisville Orchestra Brass Quintet ~ The Louisville Orchestra Brass Quintet was established, along with the Wind Quintet and String Quartet, both to provide both quality chamber music and exposure to art music for area audiences. The roster of musicians is variable, but generally made up of principal players from each of the Orchestra's brass sections. **Concert: Tuesday, September 9, 2008; 7:30 p.m., Heeren Hall. Free.**

The Burchfield Brothers ~ Jon and Ben Burchfield, from Nashville, Tennessee, have developed a unique approach to Irish-flavored hymn and praise song arrangements incorporating classical, gospel, and classical styles. Jon is a master of classical guitar. Ben performs on an instrument called the MalletKat, which can be described as a "midi-marimba," producing sounds that range from percussion to full orchestra. Their concerts are a combination of music, storytelling, and comedy, spanning the gap between generations with the combination of recognizable material and the uniqueness of their style and instrumentation. **Concert: Tuesday, September 23, 2008; 7:30 p.m., Alumni Chapel.
