Library

Withdrawal

Seminary policy allows a student to withdraw from a
class by the midpoint of each respective class and receive
a grade of WP (withdrawn passing) or WF (withdrawn
failing). Withdrawal after this date is recorded as an

grade if they simply stop attending class without dropping

25100 Introduction to Church History I **3 hours**
