Withdrawal

30000 Christian Preaching 3 hours

A basic course in principles of preaching as they relate to exegesis of the Hebrew and Greek texts, context, content, application, structure, style, and delivery of sermons. 30020 Preaching Practicum 3 hours

Sermons by students who are preparing for a preaching ministry will be analyzed and evaluated by the instructor using live and video techniques with attention given to biblical content, organization, application, style, and delivery. 20200 Introduction to Old Testament I 3 hours

An introduction to the Pentateuch and the historical books of the Old Testament in the English Bible,

Library Use Policies & Fees
For
Visiting Students

Dear Student,

During your studies at The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary Cleveland Ohio extension center, you will have access to the services and resources of the Ashland Theological Seminary library in addition to those services and resources provided by the Boyce Centennial Library on Southern Seminary's main campus. This document will help you with basic information regarding Ashland's library policies and fees. Your center director is available to help you learn how to use the library. The most up-to-date information will be available from the Ashland Theological Seminary library website, <http://seminary.ashland.edu/academics/academicslibrary.html>.

General Information

The ATS Library has an automated circulation system. All Seminary faculty, staff and students MUST have a photo identification card which is issued either at new student orientation or from Ashland University. Materials are charged out for 28 days and may be renewed twice unless there is a hold on the item. Items may be renewed by phone (419-289-5169), in person or on the library page of the AU Website (web renewal is possible as long as they are not overdue.) Periodicals, reference materials, dissertations, theses and projects must remain in the library so that they are available to all patrons. The fine for overdue items is 25 cents per day for the first 20 days and 50 cents a day beyond the first 20 days for seminary items and 50 cents per day for OhioLink items. For seminary items, students have 7 days of grace to return overdue books. After that time, returned books are fined for all the overdue days. The charge for items which are lost or never returned will be a minimum of \$60.00 for seminary items plus a \$5.00 processing fee and \$115.00 for OhioLink items. Any student owing \$25.00 or more in library charges will have his/her ATS library and OhioLink privileges suspended until the fine is cleared.

Fees for Overdue Items

OhioLink fees for items returned 30 days or longer after the due date will be subject to a maximum overdue fine of \$0.50 per day for 30 days (\$15 cap). There is a \$75 replacement fee, plus a \$35 processing fee after an item has been overdue for 30 days. If materials are returned, the \$75 fee will be waived, but the \$35 will still be charged. Items that are overdue for 30 days will cost \$50.00. Lost items will cost \$125.00. Any questions on this can be directed to any one of the library staff.

Courtesy Card (For Non-Ashland Patrons)

Non-seminary patrons may purchase a courtesy card, good for one year, for \$15.00 which entitles checkout of up to 5 books
